UK NARIC's independent, objective evaluation and benchmarking study of selected Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) courses and the ICAI Chartered Accountant designation in the UK education system finds:

- ICAI Intermediate Course comparable to RQF Level 6, Bachelor degree standard.
- ICAI Final Course comparable to RQF Level 7, Master's degree standard.
- ICAI Chartered Accountant (CA) designation comparable to RQF Level 7, Master's degree standard.

Fully qualified ICAI Chartered Accountants (ie candidates w ho have passed all the ICAI Final course examinations and training requirements) can be aw arded credit READ MORE

Grade Comparisons (IGC) database have been able to compare the overall upper secondary performance of international students with various combinations of A level grades (A*A*A*, A*A*A, etc).

Now the database goes one step further, enabling users to establish comparable single subject grades, w herever possible. READ MORE
